The essentials

- Transition Social Story to enable learning outside of school environment
- Area to work every day
- Visual timetable
- Timer
- Reward Chart
- SOW (Scheme of Work) A plan of what you want to achieve over the next number of weeks

You DO NOT have to set up a home school from day one.

Every child is different, some will need a intensive timetable straight away to maintain structure and routine. Some will need a little more time to adjust and that is fine.

My child needs routine and schedule.

- Use the social story to help transition the learning to home
- Try to mimic the school timetable where possible.

- Try and ensure the area you choose to work in has minimal visual distractions
- Use our FREE reward chart for breaks in learning.
- Enjoy this time there is no pressure on you to create a perfect learning environment. Just do little bits each day.


My child is more flexible with changes to routine

- Take it easier slowly introduce a learning schedule at home.
- Working from a few hours a day and building up to a full schedule
- Use the reward chart to work in rewards for achieving goals or tasks.
- Enjoy this time with your child, don't force the situation. No one is going to assess your performance to implement home schooling.

It is important that the tools you use as parent are aligned to the curriculum your child is studying. Whether that is the NC, IB or alternative curriculum.
